

WHAT IS THACKER PASS?

Thacker Pass, or Peehee Mu'huh, is a place in northern Nevada on Paiute/Shoshone Territory. It is threatened by Lithium Nevada Corporation's open pit lithium mine that will supply lithium for EV batteries.

- **Size:** 17,933 acres (28 sq. miles), 400 feet deep.
- **Time:** 46-100 year mine operation.
- **Water:** 5 million gallons of water daily.
- **Air:** Hazardous / "criteria pollutants."
- **Climate:** 152,713 tons of CO₂e annually, and dependent on sulfur from oil refineries.
- **Wildlife:** Golden eagles, Greater sage-grouse, pronghorn, Lahontan cutthroat trout, and many more are being killed and/or impacted.
- **Community:** Permits rushed in 1 year, during COVID. Many locals are opposed to the mine.
- **Human Rights:** Lithium Americas (parent company to Lithium Nevada) has been accused of human rights violations in Argentina.
- **Native People:** Tribal consultation was inadequate or non-existent. Sacred sites are being bulldozed.
- **Mine Construction:** Construction began March 6, 2023.
- **Direct Action:** Mine construction was blocked April 25, 2023 and construction traffic blocked on May 11, 2023. Lithium Nevada Corporation is suing Protect Thacker Pass and individuals.
